I John I:8-10 — If we say that we have no sin, we deceive ourselves, and the truth is not in us. If we confess our sins, He is faithful and just to forgive us *our* sins and to cleanse us from all unrighteousness. If we say that we have not sinned, we make Him a liar, and His word is not in us.

This awareness should lead you to Christ with your asking His forgiveness and inviting Him to come into your life. If you have not done this, please take time right now to pray this simple prayer:

Dear Lord Jesus, I am a sinner. I believe You died on the cross to pay for my sins. I believe You arose from the dead and are alive. I ask You to forgive me of my sins and wash me clean. Lord Jesus, I now give You control of my life. Take my life and make of it what You want. Thank You for giving me the gift of eternal life.
